als das konzentrationslager buchenwald am 11 april 1945 von einheiten der 3 u s army befreit wurde befand sich in deren gefolge ein intelligence team unter der leitung des jüdischen offiziers albert g rosenberg es hatte die aufgabe erkenntnisse über die geschichte buchenwalds und die zustände im lager zu sammeln um dieses team bei seiner arbeit zu unterstützen wurde von den befreiten häftlingen ein komitee ins leben gerufen das innerhalb von nur vier wochen einen 125seitigen bericht über das konzentrationslager verfaßte federführender kopf dabei war der Österreicher eugen kogon gleichzeitig haben ca 120 häftlinge ihre lagererfahrungen dokumentiert ihre aussagen haben sich in 168 einzeltexten niedergeschlagen in denen praktisch alle aspekte des lagerlebens und sterbens festgehalten sind beide textkörper bericht und zeugenaussagen eröffnen einen beispiellos detaillierten einblick in den gesamten mikrokosmos der lagerwelt seine

david pryce jones weaves a vivid life story through vignettes of the many famous authors friends acquaintances interview subjects who gave him personally inscribed books in signatures he offers a window onto the lives and work of these extraordinary people as a child pryce jones spent time at isaiah berlin s house as a teenager lunching with bernard berenson at i tatti he prompted an outburst about parisian anti semitism w h auden found him at oxford to praise his competition poem and he later visited auden in his loft studio in austria svetlana alliluyeva reminisced about her father joseph stalin while staying at the pryce jones house in wales a highbrow salon gathered in the home of arthur koestler who strove to be an english gentleman and who was with pryce jones in reykjavik covering the fischer spassky chess match saul bellow spoke of an old friend now a capo famiglia promising to deal with student rioters in 1968 chicago after swapping houses with pryce jones one summer jessica mitford insisted that he would have been a communist in the 1930s robert graves challenged a quotation from virgil and told the queen that she was a descendant of muhammad we meet v s naipaul a free spirit who understood that the world is what it is muriel spark would come round for lunch with the pryce joneses in florence enjoying conspiratorial stories about italian politics at his sepulchral home in heidelberg albert speer demonstrated his way of admitting a little to deny a great deal in isaac singer we see generosity candor and mischievous humor this is only a small sampling of the remarkable personalities who have left their signatures on a fascinating life

in the network of nazi camps across wartime europe prisoner of war institutions were often located next to the slave camps for jews and slavs so that british pows across occupied europe over 200 000 men were witnesses to the holocaust the majority of those incarcerated were aware of the camps but their testimony has never been fully published here using eye witness accounts held by the imperial war museum russell wallis rewrites the history of british prisoners and the holocaust during the second world war he uncovers the histories of men such as cyril rofe an anglo jewish pow who escaped from a work camp in upper silesia and fled eastwards towards the russian lines recounting his shattering experiences of the so called bloodlands of eastern poland wallis also shows how and why the knowledge of those in the armed forces was never fully publicised and how some pow accounts were later exaggerated or fictionalised british pows and the holocaust will be an essential new oral history of the holocaust and an extraordinary insight into what was known and when about the greatest crime of the 20th century

parachuted into france as a british secret agent christopher burney was arrested by the gestapo and thrown into a solitary confinement cell in a prison outside paris there he spent 526 days in complete isolation with little human contact and nothing to distract him burney developed a mental and spiritual regime that enabled him not just to survive but to develop an internal resilience that enabled him to survive his subsequent time in buchenwald concentration camp out of print for over 40 years and virtually unknown outside the u k solitary confinement has quietly developed a reputation as a modern masterpiece of contemplative literature as the critic frank kermode wrote the courage and the intellectual integrity christopher burney are far beyond what most of us would expect of ourselves readers who are genuinely inquisitive about their own souls and about the prospect for our species should read solitary confinement rebecca west one of the great masterpieces of contemplative literature ted gioia

since 1933 when a completely drugged and trial conditioned human wreck confessed to having started the reichstag fire in berlin dr joost a m meerloo has studied the methods by which systematic mental pressure brings people to abject submission and by which totalitarians imprint their subjective truth on their victims minds dr meerloo spent the first two and one half years of wwii under the pressure of nazi occupied holland witnessing at first hand the nazi methods of mental torture on more than one occasion then after personal experiences with enforced interrogation he escaped from a nazi prison and certain death to england where he was able as chief of the psychological department of the netherlands forces to observe and study coercive methods officially after the war he came to the united states as more and more cases of thought control brainwashing and mental coercion were disclosed cardinal mindszenty colonel schwable robert vogeler and others his interest grew it was dr meerloo who coined the word menticide the killing of the spirit for this peculiar crime it is dr meerloo s position that through pressure on the weak points in men s makeup totalitarian methods can turn anyone into a traitor and in the rape of the mind he goes far beyond the direct military implications of mental torture to describing how our own culture unobtrusively shows symptoms of pressurizing people s minds he presents a systematic analysis of the methods of brainwashing and mental torture and coercion and shows how totalitarian strategy with its use of mass psychology leads to systematized rape of the mind he describes the new age of cold war with its mental terror verbocracy and semantic fog the use of fear as a tool of mass submission and the problem of treason and loyalty so loaded with dangerous confusion the rape of the mind is written for the interested layman not only for experts and scientists

analyzes the development purpose and functioning of concentration camps mainly through a comparison of soviet and nazi camps concentrates on the treatment of enemies of the state rather than the racially persecuted notes however that jews were the most brutally mistreated in both nazi and soviet camps pp 195 198 deal with the closing of the soviet border to jews fleeing the nazis or alternatively the internment of the refugees
